It is our great pleasure to welcome, after a year of absence, the delegates, head delegates, observers, and faculty advisors back to the festive city of Ljubljana to once again take on the pressing issues of the day at the 12th MUNLawS Model United Nations Conference.

As the prospects of this year's conference were discussed earlier this year, it fell upon us to determine its scope and focus. Facing a wide array of global challenges – each significant in its own right – our instinct time and again was to return to the fundamental yet enduring discussion on the construction of the global order and its respect for international law – the solemn commitment of one for all with no one left behind. With the recent ceasefire in Gaza, the seeming resolution of the Armenian–Azerbaijani conflict, the groundbreaking Advisory Opinion of the International Court of Justice on the Obligations of States in Respect of Climate Change and other significant developments, a trembling light on the horizon reminding us of the promise of tomorrow still shines brightly. As a nonpermanent member of the UN Security Council, the Republic of Slovenia devoted considerable effort to fulfilling its responsibilities. It is, therefore, a privilege to count the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs of the Republic of Slovenia as our trusted partner in organizing this conference.

Furthermore, we extend our sincere gratitude to the European Parliament Liaison Office in Slovenia for their steadfast and invaluable support in bringing this conference to fruition. Representing a core institution of arguably the greatest peace project in human history, their involvement underscores the enduring importance of forging bridges in the pursuit of a cause far greater than ourselves. We are also deeply thankful to Tourism Ljubljana, which, together with the European Parliament Liaison Office in Slovenia, made it possible to organise two incredible social events.

HOW TO GET TO SLOVENIA

For citizens of EU member states and numerous other countries (including UK, US, Canada, and Australia...), a visa/resident permit is not required to visit Slovenia. If you are unsure about the status of your country regarding entry requirements, it is recommended to check the site of the Embassy, designated to the territory of Slovenia. More info on the matter of entry requirements is available [at the site of the Ministry of the Interior](#).

TRAVELLING BY CAR

Most of the cars enter Slovenia by motorways, which is also the easiest way to travel around the country. For driving a motorway, you will need to purchase a vignette and if you are entering Slovenia through the Karavanke tunnel, you can expect an additional crossing fee of about eight euros. TRAVELLING BY AIR

In addition to the daily flights to many European cities, there are two low-cost flight providers (EasyJet and Wizz Air) flying from the main Slovenian international airport, Jože Pučnik international airport Ljubljana (LJU). Another positive is the proximity of larger international airports, including Venice (VCE), Vienna (VIE) and Zagreb (ZAG). From the mentioned airports, you can complete the journey to Slovenia by bus/train/rental car or by the organised shuttles. For more detailed info, check the “Explore” section [here](#).

TRAVELLING BY BUS

Buses run to Slovenia from many European cities. Furthermore, bus travel is also well organised domestically. For timetables and the price of the journey, it is best to check the site of your chosen coach provider. For more detailed info, check the “Explore” section [here](#).

Trains to Ljubljana run daily from many European cities. The lines are operated by [the Slovenian Railways](#).

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

VENUES

Faculty of Law, University of Ljubljana



The conference will take place at the **Faculty of Law, University of Ljubljana**, Poljanski nasip 2, 1000 Ljubljana. The faculty is located in the Ljubljana city center, so all of the necessities are within walking distance (supermarket, pharmacy, bakeries, coffee shops). The **WiFi** you may use at the faculty is "PF events", accessible with the following password: 99xysaQWe. **Meals** at the conference include buffet style lunches every day and coffee/tea with snacks during coffee breaks. The **dress code** of the conference is, according to our Rules of Procedure, formal.

House of European Union

The House of European Union (*Hiša EU*) is located at Dunajska cesta 20, 1000 Ljubljana, approximately a 20-minute walk from the Faculty of Law. It houses the Office of the European Commission in Slovenia and the Liaison Office of the European Parliament in Slovenia, and features the multimedia center **Europa Experience**. Delegates are invited to visit the House of the European Union on Friday, 28 November, at 17:00.



Pavilion at Ljubljana Exhibition and Convention Centre



The Pavilion at Ljubljana Exhibition and Convention Centre (*Gospodarsko razstavišče*), located right next to the House of European Union, is a pub with a concept that offers a wide selection of high-quality domestic and international beers, served on tap in the Belgian style. On Friday, 28 November, from 18:00 to 22:00, the bar will welcome delegates to enjoy the **EuroEvening**.

Nebotičnik (Skyscraper)

Once the tallest building in the Kingdom of Yugoslavia and the first earthquake-proof building in southeastern Europe, **Nebotičnik** remains one of Ljubljana's most iconic landmarks. Located just an 11-minute walk from the venue, attendees of MUNLawS 2025 will enjoy an **Ultimate Ljubljana Experience** with breathtaking views of the city on Saturday, 29 November, at 21:00. A welcome drink is waiting for you!



GETTING AROUND LJUBLJANA


Ljubljana is a fairly small and very walkable city, so most destinations are reachable by foot. However if your accommodation is further from the city center, a city bus is a good option. For traveling by a bus you need a card called "Urbana" or you can pay by card.

Urbana can be purchased at machines, available at bigger bus stops, where you can also add credit to your card. You can also use the [Urbana Mobile App](#), available for Android or iOS smartphones as a virtual card. A ride costs 1.50€. You can access more information [here](#).

The two closest bus stops to the venue are Lutkovno gledališče (Krekov trg) and Zmajski most. The Lutkovno gledališče stop is served by bus line 2, which connects Zelena jama and Nove Jarše. The Zmajski most stop is served by bus lines 13 (connecting Sostro and Center Stožice) and 20 (connecting Fužine and Nove Stožice). The map of all bus lines is available [here](#). If you are able to reach the venue on foot, we recommend this option, as buses often experience delay, especially during peak traffic hours (particularly on Friday afternoons) or in rainy weather. On weekdays and Saturdays, buses generally operate between 5:00 and 22:30. There are certain bus lines, night routes, operating outside typical hours. Those lines are N1 going from the city centre to Gameljne (with departures at 22:30, 23:15, and midnight), N3 from city centre to Rudnik (last departure at 23:15), N5 from Podutik to Štepanjsko naselje (last departure from city centre at 23:15) and N5 from Štepanjsko naselje to Podutik (last departure from city centre at 23:15).

As of this year, [Uber](#) operates in Slovenia. Another taxi service that allows you to book a ride through an app is [Metro Taxi](#).

Crossing the street outside of designated pedestrian crossings (jaywalking) is prohibited. Violations may (and often do) result in a 40 EUR fine.



OTHER

Tap water in Slovenia is drinkable and of the best quality. Regarding **data roaming**, you can find some useful information [here](#). The **power outlet** in Slovenia can be seen in the picture. A limited number of power outlets will be available in all committee rooms, as well as throughout the venue.

Weather in Ljubljana can change quickly, so carrying a small umbrella is recommended. Mornings can be quite foggy and cold. Daylight hours throughout the winter are short, with sunset typically taking place around 16:30.

Most **stores are closed on Sunday** so make sure you buy all essentials prior to that. Some small shops and petrol stations with limited convenience shops remain open on Sunday. Restaurants and coffee shops will generally be open, but opening hours might vary from other days of the week.

The **tourist tax** is 3.13 EUR per person, and 1.57 EUR for children. This fee applies to all types of accommodation.

For EU citizens as well as citizens of Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Switzerland and the UK, we recommend ordering the **European Health Insurance Card** before your trip to Ljubljana. It is a free card that gives you access to medically necessary, state-provided healthcare during a temporary stay in Slovenia. The card is issued by your national health insurance provider. 


MAIN FLOOR




FIRST FLOOR




GROUND FLOOR

PREPARE FOR MUNLawS

Each delegate is expected to prepare for the Conference i.e. write a position paper for the political committees or write a memorial for the court committees and familiarize themselves with the MUNLawS Rules of Procedure of the allocated committee. All relevant documents are available on our website in the Documents section, which you can access [HERE](#).

In your position paper you outline political and legal issues regarding your allocated State, in relation to the topic at hand, present your country's views or arguments and propose solutions. It is forbidden to submit papers, written by the AI. All submitted work will be checked. However, you may use AI for your research and preparation. We strongly advise you to start your research well before the conference and submit it on time! The position paper must be submitted [HERE](#).

When you have finished your position paper/memorandum (legal committees), you must also submit it to: position_papers@munlaws.com. The deadline for submission is **24 November 2025**. Title your email in the following way: Position paper - Name of the Committee - Name of the represented country/role in the court/MEP (example: Position paper - SC HS - Germany). Should the committee have multiple discussion topics, papers must be merged into a single document. It is expected that they are in .pdf format. The maximum upload capacity is limited to 11MB.

When you are done with formalities, such as submitting your position paper, it is time for the actual conference. If it is your first time attending a MUN conference or if you are uncertain about your diplomatic skillset, here is a quick rundown of what you can expect in a committee.

- a. **Political committee:** the working procedure of a political committee will be led by Committee directors (Chairs, together referred to as the Presidency). Their job is to review and score your position papers, guide the discussion, oversee and score each delegate's performance and decide on awards. Staff members greatly aid to this process by passing your notes, supervising the committee and tackling any of your uncertainties and issues. Lastly, the members of the Secretariat will always be at your disposal for any questions and feedback.
- b. **Legal committee:** the working procedure of a court committee will be led by the Presidents of the Court who also prepared a Fictional Case for their committee . Their job is to oversee the workings of the committee, review the sent memorandums and score the performance of the participants. Here too, the members of the staff and the Secretariat will be at your disposal. To learn about specific roles of each committee read the provided MUNLawS Rules of Procedure.

OPENING CEREMONY

The conference will start with the opening ceremony, which will take place on Friday, 28 November 2023 at 11 AM in the Golden Lecture Hall of the Faculty of Law, University of Ljubljana (Poljanski nasip 2, 1000 Ljubljana). After the opening speeches, presented by guests, who are working in the field of diplomacy, international relations, and law, we will host a panel, titled “**Security and EU Multiannual Financial Framework: Global Challenger, Joint Solutions**”.

The keynote speakers of the opening ceremony will be Prof Dr Vasilka Sancin, Honorary Chair of MUNLawS 2025 conference and Dr Marko Rakovec, Director-General for International Law and Protection of Interests at the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs.



Prof. Dr. Vasilka Sancin is a judge at the European Court of Human Rights (2025-2034), Full Professor of International Law, Former Member of the UN Human Rights Council Advisory Committee (2022-2025), Former Member of the UN Human Rights Committee (2019-2022), Former Vice-Chair of the Committee (2021-2022) Former Special Rapporteur on Follow-up to Concluding Observations (2021-2022), and Arbitrator and Member of the Bureau at the Court for Conciliation and Arbitration within OSCE. For years, Prof. Dr. Sancin has served as a valuable and dedicated mentor, as well as the President of the Organising Committee of the MUNLawS Conference. Following her appointment as a Judge at the European Court of Human Rights, Prof. Dr. Sancin assumed the role of Honorary Chair of the MUNLawS Conference.

Dr. Marko Rakovec is the Director-General of the Directorate for International Law and Protection of Interests at the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs of the Republic of Slovenia. After graduating from the University of Ljubljana and Columbia Law School, Dr. Rakovec served as Minister Counsellor and Legal Advisor to the Permanent Mission of the Republic of Slovenia to the United Nations, Deputy Head of Mission at the Embassy in Zagreb, and Head of the Human Rights Department at the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs. Dr. Rakovec also served as Secretary-General of the Diplomatic Conference for the Adoption of the Convention on International Cooperation in the Investigation and Prosecution of Genocide, Crimes against Humanity, War Crimes and other International Crimes. In 2015, he earned his Doctorate of Philosophy from the University of Ljubljana.



Attendees of the opening ceremony will be greeted by **Assistant Professor Dr. Maša Kovič Dine**, President of the Organising Committee of the MUNLawS 2025 Conference and Head of the Department of International Law at the Faculty of Law, University of Ljubljana. The conference itself will be officially opened by MUNLawS 2025 Secretary-General, **Žiga Murn Lindič**.

The round-table in the framework of the opening ceremony will host Members of the European Parliament, **Romana Tomc** (EPP), Dr **Vladimir Prebilič** (Greens/EFA), **Matjaž Nemec** (S&D) and **Matej Tonin** (EPP). The event will be moderated by **Matija Stepišnik**, Editor-in-Chief of *Večer*.



Romana Tomc graduated from the Faculty of Economics, University of Ljubljana. She worked at the Chamber of Commerce and Industry and the Employers' Association of Slovenia, then served as Director of the Public Scholarship Fund and State Secretary at the Ministry of Labour. From 2011 to 2014, she was a Member and Vice-President of the National Assembly. Elected to the European Parliament in 2014, she was re-elected in 2019 and 2024 and is Vice-President of the EPP Group.

Dr. Vladimir Prebilič studied History and Geography at the University of Ljubljana and earned a Master's and PhD in Defence Studies. A university professor since 1999, he advised the President on patriotism (2008–2011), was Mayor of Kočevje (2010–2024) and President of the Association of Municipalities (2022–2024). Before his 2024 election to the European Parliament, he served in the Congress of Local and Regional Authorities of the Council of Europe (2016–2024) and chaired the Socialist, Green and Progressive Democrats group (2023–2024).

Matjaž Nemec studied International Business in Ljubljana (2013) and earned a Master's in 2017. He worked in government roles, including assistant to the President (2012–2014), and was a local councillor (2006–2014) and Member of the National Assembly (2014–2022), serving as Vice-President and committee chair. Since 2018, he has been Vice-President of the Social Democrats and a Member of the European Parliament since 2022.

Matej Tonin earned both his undergraduate and master's degrees in political science from the Faculty of Social Sciences at the University of Ljubljana. From 2018 to 2025, he served as president of the Nova Slovenija – Christian Democrats party. He was President of the National Assembly in 2018 and a Member of the National Assembly from 2011 to 2024. Between 2020 and 2022, he held the position of Deputy Prime Minister of the Republic of Slovenia. Since 2024, he has been serving as a Member of the European Parliament within the EPP Group.


Matija Stepišnik studied Journalism at the University of Ljubljana (2006). He worked at *Ekipa* (1998–2006) and has been Editor-in-Chief at *Večer* since 2006, also serving as Editor of Current Affairs and Business since 2010. He writes as a columnist for RTV Slovenija (since 2009) and has held leadership roles in the Slovene Association of Journalists (President 2011–2015, board member since 2015).

The Opening Ceremony will be held with the support of the European Parliament Liaison Office in Ljubljana, and will be **livestreamed by the Slovenian Press Agency (STA)**. The event, which will be followed by a reception, will also be attended by ambassadors and distinguished guests with expertise in the fields addressed by the conference committees and topics.

DISCOVER LJUBLJANA

Ljubljana (pop. 293,000) is one of the smallest European capitals. It's never crowded – but also never boring. 50,000 university students give it its youthful appeal, and as an economic and cultural hub of Slovenia, it has a lot to offer to locals and visitors alike. Ljubljana is the green capital of a green country. The area on either side of the river with its picturesque bridges and the central market owes its distinctive appearance to the great architect Jože Plečnik. The city of thousands of events is surrounded by parks and areas of protected nature.
