## RULES FOR DETERMINING BEST SMALL AND LARGE DELEGATIONS

- 1. The best small delegation (from 2 to 9 delegates) receives the Best Small Delegation Award. The best large delegation (10 or more delegates) receives the Best Large Delegation Award.
- 2. When a member of a delegation receives the Best Delegate award in their own committee, the delegation receives three (2) points. When a member of a delegation receives an Honorable Mention award in their own committee, the delegation receives one (1) point. When a member of a delegation receives Most Improved Delegate Awards in their own committee, the delegation receives one (1) point. All the points are calculated, and divided by the square root of the number of delegates. The delegation with the largest amount of points receives the award mentioned in the previous paragraph.
- 3. If two or more delegations receive the same number of points, the award is given to the delegation with more Best Delegate awards. If the number of Best Delegates awards is the same, the award is given to the delegation with more total awards. If the number of total awards is the same, the award is given to the delegation with higher point average as scored by the Chairs.
